14th Annual SOM Charity Derby June 23

The M.O.M.C., Grosse Pointe Yacht Club, Detroit Yacht Club and the Detroit Athletic Club teamed up for the 14th annual Special Olympics of Michigan Charity Muskie Derby.

This year, the M.O.M.C. was able to donate over \$10,000 to the Special Olympics Michigan. This is currently one of the largest charity events on the lake with over \$100,000 currently raised for the Special Olympics.

The first place fish was a 52" beauty caught aboard C'Mon Fish, captained by Greg Nelson and sponsored by the Country Club of Detroit and the GPYC. The second place fish was a 501/2" hog caught aboard the Hot Tuna, captained by Jerry Iwanski and sponsored by the Detroit Athletic Club and the M.O.M.C. The third place fish for the day was caught aboard the Sundown, sponsored and captained by Ron Welsch.

This event, once again, was a tremendous success. Many thanks go out to the captains, sponsors, and especially the GPYC for being such gracious hosts.

Joe Lepage Classic June 6-7

The Joe LePage Classic was held June 6-7 at MacRay Harbor in Harrison Township. The fishing was just as awesome as the weather; many big fish were brought to the scales.

Mike Ross aboard the "Gore May" brought the first fish to the scale, it had a 52 7/8" length and weighed 33.4 LBS, and this fish was released. Matt Mueller aboard the "Huntress" brought in a nice fish later in the morning that weighed 31.95 LBS, this too was released. The rest of the day went by quietly when, around 6:00PM, the "Passin' Gas" crew brought in a 52" fish that weighed 29.75 LBS, this fish was released.

Then, about 7:00PM, the second largest fish of the day hit the scales, a 50 ½", 33.2 LB hog caught aboard the "Blaze of Glory", by Justin Krupsky. It was released.

Sunday morning started off with Enzo Cerqua aboard My Mistress weighing a fish that was caught the night before. This fish was unable to be released.

The eventual winner hit the scales around 1:30PM on Sunday. Phil Garofalo aboard Peppino brought in a beautiful 51 7/8" fish that weighed 34.85 lbs. This fish was also able to be released.

With the scales closed, Bill Finch aboard the "Just One More" pulled a 50 7/8" fish that weighed 35.5 lbs. This fish was weighed at the Thames River and released. Bill's fish is currently in first place in the year end standings.

The M.O.M.C. would like to thank Mac and Ray's for hosting this event for the second straight year. The facilities are top notch and the food is excellent.

In Memoriam

The M.O.M.C. lost a dear friend recently as Don Gruschow passed away on June 12, 2009. Don was the captain of the "Donald Duck" and a major supporter of the club, especially the Special Olympics Derby.

Don's son captained the Duck this year and was able to fish it, in his father's honor, at the SOM Derby. Don's kindness and generosity will be sorely missed.

Catch and Release

There are a lot of new members in the club this year. It looks as though muskie fishing is really gaining popularity in this area. Because of this, it seems like a good time to go over some catch and release basics. Our muskie fishery is as good as it is because of us and we intend to keep it that way!

When you have a big fish on, slow your boat down or stop it if possible. This decreases the likelihood you will play the fish to a point of exhaustion. If you think you have a big fish on, Begin to fill your live well with fresh water. David Clark "Liquid Sedation" builds a beautiful tank call the "Fish ThANKS" system. This is probably the greatest muskie fishing tool ever invented. If you don't have one, it is worth every penny you will spend on it.

Make sure you have a good net that is large enough to handle a muskie. Frabill and Beckmann make great nets with large, treated netting for this purpose.

Once the fish is in the boat quickly remove or cut the hooks. Knipex makes a great set of Mini Bolt Cutters designed for this. Get the fish in the live well and make sure to keep it upright while the cooler water helps resuscitate the fish. NO ICE, this may shock the fish. Remove the fish, supporting it horizontally as to prevent stress on the internal organs and the spine of the fish. Snap a quick photo and get the fish back in the water. If the surface temperature is very warm, assist the fish to deeper water either by swimming it down or gently "Torpedoing" it to deeper water.

There are a lot of big tournaments coming up this summer. Expect to see the MOMC trailer and tank at these tournaments to assist in the successful release of our big girls!
